periodically re-evaluate medical assistants' skills, particularly if problems, such as con-sistently abnormal vital signs, are noted. Additionally, licensed emergency medical technicians acting in a hospital, clinic or pri-vate office setting are also restricted to only those tasks deemed acceptable for delegation to medical assistants.2

Use of Unlicensed Medical Assistants in the Physician's Office

Vital signs include blood pressure, pulse, breathing rate and temperature. The physical exam involves measuring height and weight, as well as looking for deformities or irregularities on the patient's body. A medical assistant obtains a medical history by asking patients questions about their medical conditions, medications and allergies.

Medical Skills . Medical assistants are not doctors or nurses but must provide simple medical and nursing care under the direction of doctors. You'll be asked to administer medications, give injections, apply dressings, draw blood, secure blood and urine samples, remove sutures, perform EKGs, and convey information and relay questions from doctors to patients and vice-versa.

Vital Sign #3: Respirations. The respiratory rate is the number of breaths taken per minute. It's measured at rest by watching the chest rise and fall. To avoid unintentional changes in breathing patterns due to anxiety, checking respirations is something a medical assistant does without telling the patient.

What Vital Signs Does a Medical Assistant Check ...

The medical assistant typically takes vital signs before the patient sees the physician. There is a standard measurement for each vital sign. Taking vital signs is important to create a baseline for future physical exams and at times when the patient is sick or ill. Vital signs include blood pressure, pulse rate, respiration rate and temperature.

How to Take Vital Signs as a Medical Assistant

A medical assistant should consider certain factors that can increase or decrease blood pressure when taking vital signs. These factors include age, gender, diurnal variations, emotional states, exercise, body position and medication taken. Vital Sign #3: Heart Rate

Vital signs give the medical assistant and attending physician a guide to a patients' health offering clues along with symptoms for possible health issues and treatment options. Vital signs include body temperature, heart rate, blood pressure, respiration rate and oxygen saturation.
